Not everything need be systematic.

dedalvs

Conlanging is less than a thousand years old (that we know of). Still lots to be done!

dedalvs

For glossing, use hyphens to separate elements, and use periods as spaces, e.g. zeanat /be.beautiful-INF/ (no need for a final period).

Kitchen Sink Lang: A language that throws in everything but the kitchen sink.

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Relex: A language that simply relexifies one's first language.

ANADEW: Another Natlang Already Does Even Worse.

dedalvs

The first language I created was terrible. The tenth was less terrible. The twentieth was less terribler. It gets better.

dedalvs

Think Turkish is all simple cut and paste? Accusative: -i. Genitive: -in. Locative: -de. Ablative: -den. TELL ME THAT'S AN ACCIDENT.

Morphemes are your enemy.

dedalvs

Tone isn't tough if you really get after it and say, "ALL RIGHT LET'S DO THIS!!!"

dedalvs

Back in my day we didn't even tell other people we created languages. Y'all lucky...

dedalvs

You do NOT need to be a good artist to create a good writing system!

dedalvs

FYI if you're messaging me before noon, I'm either asleep or getting ready. I can't change me, man. :(

dedalvs

The nominative/absolutive is usually the simplest form of a noun, but not always (cf. Chickasaw or Nahuatl).

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Languages can have the equivalent of a passive without having any passive morphology or passive constructions.

dedalvs

Signed up for classes next semester yet? If not, please, PLEASE consider adding a language course. It will help you immeasurably.

dedalvs

Before asking about "trigger" languages, google "dedalvs trigger alan yu" and click on the first hit.

dedalvs

A major component of the Castithan language was inspired by a game mechanic in World of Warcraft that had nothing to do with language.

dedalvs

If you're not seeing anything new in the natlangs you're looking up, look up a sign language.

dedalvs

Music is usually the answer.

dedalvs

You can "rent" the music rooms in the basement of Morrison for free with your student ID. I learned this WAY too late.

dedalvs

If you're ever stuck talk to someone! Or jog. Or play video games. Or eat something. Or go to Ghirardelli in SF (chances are I'll be there).

dedalvs

Apparently Mapos Buang and Yanyuwa have phonemic uvular nasals that contrast with velar nasals. Who knew?

dedalvs

It is apparently possible to do a voiceless implosive; they're just vanishingly rare.

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Ejectives are easier in the back of the throat; implosives easier in the front (/q'/ is more common than /p'/; /b/ is more common than /g/).

dedalvs

Voicing is harder to maintain the further back in the throat you go. Hence, /b/ is much more common than /c/.

dedalvs

Slack works on desktop or mobile. I figure this may be news to at least one person, so...there it is.

<u>dedalvs</u>

Since there's limited vertical space in Slack, if you want to start a discussion about a specific subtopic, start a new thread.

dedalvs

FYI on Slack, rather than responding to something "lol" or "yeah", you can actually right click on a post and emote to it (e.g. or).

Do offer help to and ask questions of your fellow students! That's what the Slack is for!

If some element of the course isn't working for you, please let me know so we can address it!

A linguistics major can add value to any job or company. Why? BECAUSE LITERALLY EVERYTHING HUMANS DO RELIES ON LANGUAGE. Don't forget that!

Analogy is a powerful tool when it comes to both shaping paradigms and generating new morphological forms.

Two languages with switch reference systems: Chickasaw and Hittite.

dedalvs

Don't forget there are materials on course reserve in Moffitt for this class!

dedalvs

If you're stuck, pull up the grammar of a random language on Wikipedia. Lot of crazy stuff in natural languages!

Don't confuse synchronic analysis for diachronic explication.

dedalvs

Most of the flora and fauna in the Song of Ice and Fire universe is identical to ours, so feel free to borrow real world plants and animals.

dedalvs

If you want to look at some good conlangs, google Kēlen, ámman îar, Ithkuil, Brithenig, Rikchik, Wenedyk, Teonaht, Idrani, Moten, Okuna...

dedalvs

Split-ergative systems that are split by tense usually arise from old passive constructions (cf. Hindi).

dedalvs

For most assignments I list the minimum requirements. There's ALWAYS more to it than what we go over in class.

dedalvs

Creating a language is daunting if you focus on the whole thing at once. Just focus on one small part of it, and take it one part at a time.
